Part 1 of 5 in the series Fear Not: Trusting God for Life Unafraid
Romans 8:22-25

•
Fear is centered in the <u>amygdala</u> .
An effect of the fear response is that we
<u>think</u> less clearly,
have difficulty receiving and assimilating new <u>information</u> ,
make mistakes in perception and interpretation, and
default to risk avoidance.
A future built on fear is not a <u>Christian</u> future.
At the core of the Christian mission is helping people hear the voice of the
<u>Spirit</u> of God promising our adoption as <u>children of God</u> .
The only thing that has a chance of freeing us from the tyranny of <u>Fear</u>
and moving us into God's future is <u>hope</u> .
The believer's vocationis to bring <u>God's Future</u> into the present The values and priorities of God's dominion are believed only so far
as they are <u>enacted</u> ." - Craig Hill, <i>In God's Time</i> (Eerdmans, 2002), 197-198
The Book of Daniel as an encouragement to hope against fear
The stories in Daniel begin in about <u>597</u> B.C. when the Judeans are taken
captive into Babylon . The book was actually written about 400
years later during the ruthless rule of the <u>Seleucid</u> empire.
The author of Daniel writes down these stories to help an oppressed people
learn to choose <u>God's Future</u> against one defined by <u>Fear</u>
The significance of enacted hope
Questions of faith are not <u>abstract</u> . Nearly everything we do in life is
an opportunity for <u>hope</u> in God's future.
In the face of danger and uncertainty we need a strong <u>memory</u> that God is the ruler yet.

#### DAILY SCRIPTURE READINGS

**Mon. 9/12/2016** Daniel 1 Daniel and his friends chosen as courtiers Daniel and his friends find their way into the court of the King of Babylon and resolve to remain faithful to God against the command of the terrifying king Nebuchadnezzar.

**Tue. 9/13/2016** Daniel 2:48-3:30

The fiery furnace

Nebuchadnezzar promotes Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego to be administrators of Babylon, but they refuse to worship a golden statue at the king's command. They are punished by being thrown into a furnace of fire.

Wed. 9/14/2016 Daniel 5

King Belshazzar's feast

The new ruler of Babylon throws a feast in which mysterious handwriting appears on the walls of the palace. Daniel interprets the handwriting and is rewarded.

Thu. 9/15/2016 Daniel 6

The lions' den

The new king Darius is tricked by some in his court to impose a law that whomever prays to anyone but the king would be punished by being thrown into a den of lions. Daniel continues to pray to the Lord God and is given the punishment prescribed by the law.

**Fri. 9/16/2016** Daniel 7:1, 9-14

A vision of the true king

Daniel is granted a vision of a great beast being judged by the "Ancient One," who has dominion that is everlasting and shall never pass away. The Beast was a symbol for the Seleucid Empire, which ruled Palestine at the time the stories of Daniel were written down.

**Sat. 9/17/2016** Daniel 12 The promise to those who persevere Daniel sees a vision of the resurrection of the dead. He learns that this is God's promise to those who persevere in faith through terrible persecution. The first readers of this promise would have been those Jews enduring the persecution of the Seleucid ruler Antiochus IV Epiphanes.
